1. General

Please write your text in good English American or British usage is accepted, Type the manuscript, using single spacing and margins given below. Do not exceed 20 pages. Ensure that each new paragraph is clearly indicated.

2. Title.

Give Concise and informative Title in the following format;

Fonts : Times New Roma **Size** 14 points **Style**: BOLD **Alignment**: Centre

Author names and affiliations. Please indicate names of Authors clearly. Present the authors' affiliation addresses below the names. Surname should be written in CAPITAL.

Corresponding author. Underline the author who is willing to handle correspondence at all stages of refereeing and publication, also post-publication.

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Name of the Authors (Surname must be in CAPITAL letters)

(Fonts : Times New Roman **Size** 12 points **Style** : BOLD)

Affiliation

(Fonts : Times New Roman **Size** 11 points **Style** : Regular)

3. Fonts and Style for the Text

Write entire text in Times New Roman fonts, Size 11 and Style Regular. All the section titles must be numbered, and they are in Times New Roman Fonts, Size 12 and Style Bold. All the sub-section titles must be numbered, and they are in Times New Roman Fonts, Size 11 and Style Bold.

4. Abstract

A concise abstract up to 150 words is required. The abstract should state briefly the purpose of the research, the methods used, the principal results and major conclusions

Keywords. Immediately after the abstract, provide a maximum of five to ten keywords.

5. Abbreviations.

Define abbreviations and symbols that are not standard in this field at their first occurrence in the article: in the abstract but also in the main text after it. Ensure consistency of abbreviations throughout the article.

6. Subdivisions

Divide your article into clearly defined and numbered sections. Subsections should be numbered 1.1 (then 1.1.1), 1.2, etc. (the abstract is not included in section numbering). Use this numbering also for internal cross-referencing. Any subsection may be given a brief heading. Each heading should appear on its own separate line.

7. Mathematical formulae.

Present simple formulae in the line of normal text where possible. In principle, variables are to be presented in italics. Use the solidus (/) instead of a horizontal line, e.g., X_p/Y_m rather than $\frac{X_p}{Y_m}$

Powers of e are often more conveniently denoted by \exp . Number consecutively any equations that have to be displayed separate from the text (if referred to explicitly in the text). Important formula and equation must be given numbers in brackets.

Example

$$\bar{X} = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^n x f(x) = a_0 + \sum_{n=1}^{\infty} (a_n \cos \frac{n\pi x}{L} + b_n \sin \frac{n\pi x}{L})}{n} \quad (1)$$

8. Figures and Tables

All the figures, charts, graphs, photographs, tables etc. must be numbered with proper captions. They may be numbered like Figure 1 OR Table 1 OR Graph 1 OR Chart 1 etc. The caption of the figure, charts, graphs, photographs, tables should not be a part of the same. The caption of the table along with its number may be preceded by the table and for figures, charts, etc it is succeeded by them.

For the better result the figures, charts, photographed should be provided in the format given bellow in high resolution (soft copy is also desired).

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TIFF: Combinations bitmapped line/half-tone (colour or greyscale): a minimum of 500 dpi is required.

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PLEASE DO NOT SUPPLY PICTURE FILES WHICH ARE TOO LOW IN RESOLUTION

Do not use any type of shading on computer-generated illustrations. Remove non-essential areas of a photograph.

9. Acknowledgements.

Place acknowledgements, including information on grants received, before the references, in a separate section, and not as a footnote on the title page.

10. References

Responsibility for the accuracy of bibliographic citations lies entirely with the authors.

Citations in the text: Please ensure that every reference cited in the text is also present in the reference list (and vice versa). Any references cited in the abstract must be given in full. Unpublished results and personal communications should not be in the reference list.

Citing and listing of web references. As a minimum, the full URL should be given. Any further information, if known (author names, dates, reference to a source publication, etc.), should also be given. Web references can be listed separately (e.g., after the reference list) under a different heading if desired, or can be included in the reference list.

Text: Indicate references by number(s) in square brackets in line with the text. The actual authors can

be referred to, but the reference number(s) must always be given.

Example: "...as demonstrated [3,6]. Desai and Patel [8] obtained a different result...."

List: Number the references (numbers in square brackets) in the list in the order in which they appear in the text.

Examples:

Reference to a journal publication:

[1] J. A.B. Desai, C.D. Shah, The art of writing a scientific article, Journal of Applied Science. 163 (2000) 51- 59.

Reference to a book:

[2] W. Strunk Jr., E.B. White, The Elements of Style, third ed., Macmillan, New York, 1979.

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
