All over the world there are thousands of forests. They're very important to us. Do you know why ? Well, not only do they provide us with timber but they also give us the raw material out of which paper is made. What's most important is that they replace the oxygen which we breathe from the air. You can see then that it's necessary for us to save the forests. Unfortunately, many forests are damaged every year by something which can be avoided - fire. Fire can destroy thousands of acres of valuable forest in just a few hours - a forest which has taken perhaps a hundred years to grow.

How do these terrible fires start ? Do you think they just happen ? No, of course they don't. They are started by people. They don't start them on purpose, of course. They start them by accident. But most of these accidents can be avoided. It's very easy to start a forest fire, especially in the summer when the grass and wood are dry. It only needs a dropped cigarette end, or even a spark, to set a whole forest on fire. Because the fires start so easily, a constant look out is kept in many forests. Special towers are built and fire wardens sit in these, watching for smoke. If they spot a fire, they immediately inform their headquarters.
